
What are conflict minerals & Why Tantalum related?

Conflict minerals are:

"Conflict minerals," as defined by the US legislation, currently include the metals **tantalum**, tin, tungsten and gold, which are the derivatives of the minerals cassiterite, columbite-tantalite and wolframite, respectively.

Why they are called Conflict minerals: Because they are mined an area of armed conflict and traded illicitly to finance the fighting. Often armed forces exploit children as child labors in smelters and refiners.
